Maharashtra College of Arts, Science and Commerce is managed by Khairul Islam Higher Education Society, Mumbai. This Society was founded under the able presidentship of Dr. Rafiq Zakaria, a veteran Parliamentarian, Writer, Educationist and Islamic Scholar.

After the demise of Dr. Rafiq Zakaria, Mrs. Fatma R. Zakaria, the eminent journalist, educationist and recipient of the Padmashri Award, has taken over Presidentship and under her leadership and dynamism, the Institute is heading towards a better tomorrow.

There was no college in the thickly populated central part of Mumbai stretching from Dhobi Talao to Parel. Students of this area, especially girls, faced difficulties in getting admission to colleges, which were mostly situated in the southern part of the city. The establishment of this College in 1968 was the realisation of a dream by selfless and dedicated educationists and social workers.

The College aims at equipping students with a moral and intellectual outlook and inculcating in them the highest principles of unity and national integration.

The College attaches great importance to the dissemination of learning and an all round development of the personality of its students. All efforts are made to create a congenial atmosphere especially for female students and every possible facility for proper education is provided to them.

The College is situated close to Mumbai Central Railway Station (Western Railway) and is also near Byculla Railway Station (Central Railway). Public transport bus facilities are also available to and from all parts of the city.

The College is affiliated to the University of Mumbai for teaching courses leading to B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. Degree Examinations. The College is also recognised for registration of students for Post-Graduation in the subjects of Islamic Studies. Jr. College is recognized by the HSC Board, Mumbai division imparting education in Arts, Science & Commerce.

The College has a well-qualified, experienced and committed teaching faculty.

COLLEGE RULES

- 1. On admission, each student will receive an IDENTITY CARD. No student will be allowed admission to lectures, practicals, College functions etc. or have access to the Library, College Office, Laboratories, Gymkhana, Canteen and even the College Premises itself without the possession of a valid identity card, which must be produced on demand, by any competent authority. Failure to observe this rule will entail withdrawal of the above privileges provided by the College. It is mandatory to wear valid identity card in the college premises.
- 2 Each student admitted to the College is expected to behave inside and outside the College in an orderly and disciplined manner and to have regard for the staff and good name of the College.
- 3. All students are answerable to the Principal, Vice-Principal and members of the staff for their conduct in the College. For their behaviour outside the College, if it adversely affects the reputation of the College, appropriate action may be taken within the principles of natural justice and equity.
- 4. Insubordination and unbecoming language or conduct in any form are sufficient reasons for the dismissal of a student.
- 5. Any form of 'Ragging' or Intimidation or Humiliation and threatening of any student by other student is strictly prohibited and is liable to the most severe penalties. The case will be registered in the Police Station.
- 6. Smoking, consumption of alcohol, drug, possession and distribution of drugs, chewing of tobacco, Paan and spitting is strictly prohibited in the College premises and College gatherings. The above offence is punishable under the Mumbai Police Act, and the offenders will be severely dealt with as per the law.
- 7. The playing of cards and any form of gambling in the College premises is prohibited.
- 8. Students must attend classes, practicals and tutorials according to the Time-Table on all working days of the College. Absence may lead to loss of a term. A term is granted to a student whose attendance is above 75% and who completes the course of study prescribed. Student will not be allowed to appear for the final examination whose attendance is below 75%. Employed students are not entitled for any concessions.

- Students should take particular care to be punctual. They will not be admitted into the class room if they are more than five minutes late. Attendance will be taken in all the classes and the student will be marked absent for that lecture.
- 10. Absence from lectures must be justified in writing in stipulated time, and if illness is the cause, a medical certificate must be submitted immediately.
- 11. Students must not attend classes other than their own.
- 12 Students are not allowed to form any society, groups, make collections, sell tickets, hold meetings, invite a person to address them and go on excursions or picnic without the permission of the Principal.
- 13. All notices put up on the notice board or any announcements made, must have the previous approval of the Principal.
- 14. All the associations and committees constituted by the Principal to conduct various co-curricular activities should not hold meetings and publish wall papers, hand bills etc. without prior approval of the Principal.
- 15. Every kind of-demonstration that restricts the freedom of the members of the College or disrupts any activity in the College is banned
- 16. Attendance for tests and examinations conducted by the College is compulsory. Defaulters will not be allowed to appear in the Examinations conducted by the Board/University.
- 17. Students are expected to take proper care of the College property and help in keeping the premises neat and tidy. Damaging the property of the College by disfiguring walls, doors, fittings or breaking furniture etc. is a breach of discipline and the guilty will be duly punished.
- 18. Students applying for certificates, testimonials, concession forms etc. and those requiring the Principal's signature on any kind of document or application, should first contact the Registrar at least two days in advance. No person should approach the Principal directly.
- 19. Students should not communicate any information about the College to the press or media without the written permission of the Principal.

- 20. Loitering in the corridor, while lectures are on, is strictly prohibited.
- 21. All students are expected to avoid any form of dress/attire or behavior which could be exibiting indecency and unaccepatability. Students who fail to conform with these norms will be asked to leave the College Premises.
- 22 Refreshments are to be consumed in the canteen area only. They are not to be taken to the staircases, upper floors, class rooms and to the Hall. Loitering any where in the campus will be penalised.
- 23. Class picnics or outings are banned. Parents are, therefore, warned that the College authorities do not assume any responsibility for such picnics or outings organised by the students on their own.
- 24. Celebration of Ribbon Day, Friendship Day, Rose day and Valentine's Day is banned and prohibited in the College premises.
- 25. Any false information submitted to the College in the admission form or otherwise will be liable for the cancellation of the admission and dismissal from the College.
- 26. Carrying Mobile Phones / Walkman / I Pods etc. in the College Premises is Strictly Prohibited. If found it will be confiscated.
- 27. Students should not bring Valuables / Jewelry in the College. College will not be responsible for the loss of their valuables and belongings. The girls students should take strict care of their belongings in Girl's Common Room. College will not be responsible for any such loss.
- 28. College Office will remain open from 10.30 a.m to 12.30 p.m. & 2.30 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. College office will remain close on every Second and Fourth Saturday.
- 29. Matters not covered by the above rules will rest at the entire discretion of the Principal.



ADMISSION POLICY

- 1. Admissions will be strictly on merit basis.
- Seats will be allotted on the merit and as per the direction of the Govt. and University for F.Y.J.C. (Arts, Science & Commerce) & F.Y.B.A./ B.Sc. / B.Com.
- Admissions to S.Y.J.C. (Arts, Science & Commerce) & S.Y.& T.Y.B.A./ B.Sc. / B.Com. will be on first come first served basis.
- 4. Students seeking admission to this College must apply in the prescribed form at the beginning of each academic year.
- 5. Subject to the availability of seats, normally a student of this College, who has qualified himself/herself for admission to the next higher class, will be admitted to such class provided an application in the prescribed form, duly filled in, is submitted with necessary fees within the notified period.
- 6. A student once admitted will be considered as duly enrolled for the academic year and he/she shall be liable to pay the full fees for the whole year unless he/she informs the Principal in writing of his/her intention to leave the College at least a week before the commencement of the second term.
- 7. For admission to the first year classes it is necessary to produce the original (i) S.S.C./H.S.C. Passing Certificate and Statement of Marks (ii) School/Jr. College Leaving Certificate (iii) Eligibility Certificate in the case of student passing an Examination other than that of the S.S.C./H.S.C. Board, Maharashtra State and (iv) Transfer Certificate, in case of the students coming from other college, affiliated to Mumbai University (v) Migration certificate in case of student coming from outside the jurisdiction of University of Mumbai.

Note:- The Admission to such Students will be provisional basis subject to the confirmation of Eligibility from the Maharashtra State Secondary & Higher Secondary Education Board.

Eligibility Procedure (Degree College).

Students, who have passed their Higher Secondary Certificate Examination from other than Maharashtra State Secondary & Higher Education Board with English as one of the ssubject are required to submit the following Original documents at the time of admission.

- 1) Marksheet 2) Passing Certificate or Provisional Passing Certificate 3) Leaving Certificate, shall be counter singed by the Educational Authority or Transfer Certificate. 4) Migration Certificate 5) Form for Provisional Statement of Eligibility form University of Mumbai.
- Note:- The Admission to such Students will be on provisional basis subject to the confirmation of Eligibility from the University of Mumbai. (It is the responsibility of the concern student to follow the procedure of verification of their documents from their respective boards/university. College in no way will be responsible for the same. Their Eligibility/Admission will be confirmed only after verification is received from the concern authorised Board.)

- 8. Those who fail to pay prescribed fees within the stipulated time will forfeit their claim for the seats. The vacant seats will be alloted to the candidates from the waiting list.
- 9. Repeaters will not be granted fresh admission.
- 10. Students from other Colleges will be admitted after obtaining requisite permission from the competent authority and verification of their original documents, and only if seats are available after granting admission to our own students.
- 11. Students seeking admission shall be careful about selecting their subjects. Subjects once selected will be final and will not be changed under any circumstances.
- 12. Students seeking admission should seriously note that the medium of instruction in the College is **English**. No Student will be allowed to answer his/her examination paper/s in any other language except ENGLISH at the Degree College level under any circumstances.

ELIGIBILITY

B.Sc. Information Technology

It is full time three years integrated course affiliated to the University of Mumbai. It is non-aided self-financing Course with limited number of seats. Hence, if the admission is cancelled the fees paid will not be refunded under any circumstances.

A Candidate for being eligible for admission to the degree course of Bachelor of Science – Information Technology, shall have passed XII standard examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or it's equivalent with Mathematics and Statistics as one of the subject and should have secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate for open category and 40% marks in aggregate in case of Reserved category candidates.

Candidate who have passed Diploma (Three years after S.S.C.-Xth Std.) in Information Technology / Computer Technology / Computer Engineering / Computer Science / Electrical, Electronics and Video Engineering and Allied Branches / Civil and Allied branches are eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course.

M.A. COURSE

- (A) For Graduate of Mumbai University / Other Universities: Those who have obtained the B.A. degree in the Mumbai University or a Corresponding degree of any other University recognized as equivalent there to, are eligible for admission to the M.A. course in English in the Department of English on Payment of prescribed fees, provided always that the question of granting admission will be at the discretion of the faculty of the Department.
- (f) As a rule, admission to the M.A. with English shall be confined only to those students who have passed the B.A. (Special) in English and have obtained at least 50% of marks (55% in the case of graduate from other Indians Universities) in the six papers in English.
- (i) Students who have offered at least three papers in English Literature carrying 300 marks are also eligible for admission to the M.A. part-I course in English, However, preference will be given to students with six papers.



Maharashtra College of Arts, Science and Commerce is managed by Khairul Islam Higher Education Society, Mumbai. This Society was founded under the able presidentship of Dr. Rafiq Zakaria, a veteran Parliamentarian, Writer, Educationist and Islamic Scholar.

After the demise of Dr. Rafiq Zakaria, Mrs. Fatma R. Zakaria, the eminent journalist, educationist and recipient of the Padmashri Award, has taken over Presidentship and under her leadership and dynamism, the Institute is heading towards a better tomorrow.

There was no college in the thickly populated central part of Mumbai stretching from Dhobi Talao to Parel. Students of this area, especially girls, faced difficulties in getting admission to colleges, which were mostly situated in the southern part of the city. The establishment of this College in 1968 was the realisation of a dream by selfless and dedicated educationists and social workers.

The College aims at equipping students with a moral and intellectual outlook and inculcating in them the highest principles of unity and national integration.

The College attaches great importance to the dissemination of learning and an all round development of the personality of its students. All efforts are made to create a congenial atmosphere especially for female students and every possible facility for proper education is provided to them.

The College is situated close to Mumbai Central Railway Station (Western Railway) and is also near Byculla Railway Station (Central Railway). Public transport bus facilities are also available to and from all parts of the city.

The College is affiliated to the University of Mumbai for teaching courses leading to B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. Degree Examinations. The College is also recognised for registration of students for Post-Graduation in the subjects of Islamic Studies. Jr. College is recognized by the HSC Board, Mumbai division imparting education in Arts, Science & Commerce.

The College has a well-qualified, experienced and committed teaching faculty.

COLLEGE RULES

- 1. On admission, each student will receive an IDENTITY CARD. No student will be allowed admission to lectures, practicals, College functions etc. or have access to the Library, College Office, Laboratories, Gymkhana, Canteen and even the College Premises itself without the possession of a valid identity card, which must be produced on demand, by any competent authority. Failure to observe this rule will entail withdrawal of the above privileges provided by the College. It is mandatory to wear valid identity card in the college premises.
- 2. Each student admitted to the College is expected to behave inside and outside the College in an orderly and disciplined manner and to have regard for the staff and good name of the College.
- 3 All students are answerable to the Principal, Vice-Principal and members of the staff for their conduct in the College. For their behaviour outside the College, if it adversely affects the reputation of the College, appropriate action may be taken within the principles of natural justice and equity.
- 4 Insubordination and unbecoming language or conduct in any form are sufficient reasons for the dismissal of a student.
- 5 Any form of 'Ragging' or Intimidation or Humiliation and threatening of any student by other student is strictly prohibited and is liable to the most severe penalties. The case will be registered in the Police Station.
- 6 Smoking, consumption of alcohol, drug, possession and distribution of drugs, chewing of tobacco, Paan and spitting is strictly prohibited in the College premises and College gatherings. The above offence is punishable under the Mumbai Police Act, and the offenders will be severely dealt with as per the law.
- 7. The playing of cards and any form of gambling in the College premises is prohibited.
- 8 Students must attend classes, practicals and tutorials according to the Time-Table on all working days of the College. Absence may lead to loss of a term. A term is granted to a student whose attendance is above 75% and who completes the course of study prescribed. Student will not be allowed to appear for the final examination whose attendance is below 75%. Employed students are not entitled for any concessions.

- 9 Students should take particular care to be punctual. They will not be admitted into the class room if they are more than five minutes late. Attendance will be taken in all the classes and the student will be marked absent for that lecture
- O Absence from lectures must be justified in writing in stipulated time, and if illness is the cause, a medical certificate must be submitted immediately.
- 1 Students must not attend classes other than their own.
- 2 Students are not allowed to form any society, groups, make collections, sell tickets, hold meetings, invite a person to address them and go on excursions or picnic without the permission of the Principal.
- B All notices put up on the notice board or any announcements made, must have the previous approval of the Principal.
- 4 All the associations and committees constituted by the Principal to conduct various co-curricular activities should not hold meetings and publish wall papers, hand bills etc. without prior approval of the Principal.
- 5 Every kind of-demonstration that restricts the freedom of the members of the College or disrupts any activity in the College is banned.
- 6 Attendance for tests and examinations conducted by the College is compulsory. Defaulters will not be allowed to appear in the Examinations conducted by the Board/University.
- T Students are expected to take proper care of the College property and help in keeping the premises neat and tidy. Damaging the property of the College by disfiguring walls, doors, fittings or breaking furniture etc. is a breach of discipline and the guilty will be duly punished.
- 8 Students applying for certificates, testimonials, concession forms etc. and those requiring the Principal's signature on any kind of document or application, should first contact the Registrar at least two days in advance. No person should approach the Principal directly.
- Students should not communicate any information about the College to the press or media without the written permission of the Principal.

2 Loitering in the corridor, while lectures are on, is strictly prohibited.

- All students are expected to avoid any form of dress/attire or behavior which could be exibiting indecency and unaccepatability. Students who fail to conform with these norms will be asked to leave the College Premises
- 2. Refreshments are to be consumed in the canteen area only. They are not to be taken to the staircases, upper floors, class rooms and to the Hall. Loitering any where in the campus will be penalised.
- 2 Class picnics or outings without the prior written permission of the principal through the in-charge professor are banned. Parents are, therefore, warned that the College authorities do not assume any responsibility for such picnics or outings organised by the students on their own.
- 2 Celebration of Ribbon Day, Friendship Day, Rose day and Valentine's Day is banned and prohibited in the College premises.
- Any false information submitted to the College in the admission form or otherwise will be liable for the cancellation of the admission and dismissal from the College.
- Carrying Mobile Phones / Walkman / I Pods etc. in the College Premises is Strictly Prohibited. If found it will be confiscated and the student will be fined.
- 27. Students should not bring Valuables / Jewelry in the College. College will not be responsible for the loss of their valuables and belongings. The girls students should take strict care of their belongings in Girl's Common Room. College will not be responsible for any such loss.
- 2.30 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. College office will remain close on every Second and Fourth Saturday.
- 2 Matters not covered by the above rules will rest at the entire discretion of the Principal.

ADMISSION POLICY

- 1. Admissions will be strictly on merit basis.
- 2 Seats will be allotted on the merit and as per the direction of the Govt. and University for F.Y.J.C. (Arts, Science & Commerce) & F.Y.B.A./ B.Sc. / B.Com.
- Admissions to S.Y.J.C. (Arts, Science & Commerce) & S.Y.& T.Y.B.A./
 B.Sc. / B.Com. will be on first come first served basis.
- 4. Students seeking admission to this College must apply in the prescribed form at the beginning of each academic year.
- 5. Admission to In-House Students: Normally a student of this College, who has qualified himself/herself for admission to the next higher class, will be admitted to such class provided an application in the prescribed form, duly filled in, is submitted with necessary fees within the notified period.
- 6. A student once admitted will be considered as duly enrolled for the academic year and he/she shall be liable to pay the full fees for the whole year unless he/she informs the Principal in writing of his/her intention to leave the College at least a week before the commencement of the second term.
- 7. For admission to the first year classes it is necessary to produce the original (i) S.S.C./H.S.C. Passing Certificate and Statement of Marks (ii) School/Jr. College Leaving Certificate (iii) Eligibility Certificate in the case of student passing an Examination other than that of the S.S.C./H.S.C. Board, Maharashtra State and (iv) Transfer Certificate, in case of the students coming from other college, affiliated to Mumbai University (v) Migration certificate in case of student coming from outside the jurisdiction of University of Mumbai.
- 8. For admission in **XI Science**, the students should have minimum 40% marks in Science subjects in S.S.C. examination.
- 9. Eligibility Procedure (Junior College).
 - Student shall have passed his/her secondary school certificate examination with five subjects & with **English** if he/she is from other than Maharashtra State Secondary & Higher Education Board. The following Original documents are required to be submitted at the time of admission:

College in no way will be responsible for the same. Their Eligibility/Admission will be confirmed only after verification is received from the concern authorised Board.)

- 10. Those who fail to pay prescribed fees within the stipulated time will forfeit their claim for the seats. The vacant seats will be alloted to the candidates from the waiting list.
- ${\tt 11.}\,{\sf Repeaters}$ will not be granted fresh admission.
- 12. No admission will be granted in F. Y. J. C. (XIth) to the students born before **01.01.2001.**
- 13. Students from other Colleges will be admitted after obtaining requisite permission from the competent authority and verification of their original documents, and only if seats are available after granting admission to our own students.

EXAMINATIONS

- 1. It is compulsory for every student to appear for every test and examination held by the College.
- 2. Students who fail to comply with ordinances 119/120/125 of the University of Mumbai and those who do not keep terms to the satisfaction of the HOD & Principal of the College, and they have not attended the prescribed numbers of lectures will be declared defaulters and as such they will not be allowed to appear for the final exams.
- Any student who fails to show satisfactory progress in all subjects at the preliminary Examination or remains absent from the examination for any reason, may not be sent for the University Examination.
- 4. The examination system for First, Second & Third year B.A., B.Sc. & B.Com. classes is based on Credit & Grading system. The Modalities of Assessment under the credit system for F.Y., S.Y. & T.Y.B.A., B.Sc. & B.Com. will be as under:

- Question paper pattern shall be as per Board of studies for each subjects.

STANDARD OF PASSING

- ➤ The student shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in inaggregate to qualify each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment & Semester End Examination. However, the student shall obtain minimum of 40% marks i. e. 10 out of 25 in the Internal Assessment and i.e. 30 out of 75 in Semester End Examination separately.
- ➤ To qualify each course minimum grade E shall be obtained by the student in each course and project wherever applicable in a particular semester.

METHOD TO CARRY FORWARD THE MARKS

- ➤ A student who PASSES in the Internal Assessment but FAILS in the Semester End Examination of the Course shall reappear for the Semester End Examination of that Course. However, his / her marks of the Internal assessment shall be earned over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him / her on passing of the complete course.
- A student who FAILS in the Internal Assessment but PASSES in the Semester End Examination of the course shall submit and reappear for the Internal assessment in the form of projects for that course. However, his / her marks of the Semester End Examination shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on qualifying the course.
- ➤ The Evaluation for students who fails in Internal Assessment will consist of one project of 25 marks which will be divided into 20 marks for the documentation of the project given by the concerned teachers on the curriculum, 5 marks for the presentation and for the viva.

ATKT (ALLOWED TO KEEP TERM)

- i) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-II irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester-I.
- ii) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-III if he / she passes (grade 'E' or above in each course) each of Semester-I and Semester-II.

OR

He / She fails in not more than three courses, in each of Semester-I and Semester-II. (For all subjects of Science carrying 900 or more marks).

He / She fails in not more than three courses with not more than total 200 marks in each of Semester-I and Semester-II. (For all subjects of Science carrying less than 900 marks).

He / She fails in not more than two courses, in each of Semester-I and Semester-II. (For all subjects of Arts & Commerce)

- iii) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-IV irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester-III.
- iv) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-V if he / she passes Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III and Semester-IV.

OR

He / She has passed Semester-I and Semester-II and fails in not more than three courses in each of Semester III and Semester IV. (For all subjects of Science carrying 900 or more marks).

He / She has passed Semester-I and Semester-II and fails in not more than three courses with not more than total 200 marks, in each of Semester III and Semester IV. (For all subjects of Science carrying less than 900 marks).

He / She has passed Semester-I and Semester-II and fails in not more than two courses in each of Semester III and Semester IV. (For all subjects of Arts & Commerce)

- v) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-VI irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester-V.
- vi) The result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV and Semester V

INTERNAL EVALUATION

- > Class test or assignment for Internal Assessment:
- a. A student who is absent for the class test and the assignment will be declared fail in the Internal Assessment Scheme.
- b. A student who is absent for the class test and has appeared for the assignment will be allowed to appear for the additional class test of 20 marks.
- c. A student who has appeared for class test but remains absent for the assignment will be allowed to appear for the additional assignment and the internal assessment will be calculated as out of 25 marks.
- d. A student who is absent for class test or assignment as the case may be, and the internal assessment will be calculated as out of 25 marks.

SEMESTER END EXAMINATIONS

All the students of the F.Y., S.Y. & T.Y. classes are required to appear for TWO Semester Examinations. One, before the end of First Semester and the Second before the end of Second Semester.

ADDITIONAL EXAMINATION

- a. The absent and failed student will be allowed to appear for the examination by the head of the institution after following the necessary formalities.
- b. This examination will be held 20 days after the declaration of results but not later than 40 days.
- c. Student who does not appear in some or all the papers at the Semester I or Semester II or Semester IV Examinations on Medical Grounds, University Level Sports, Cultural Activities, N.C.C., Camp and any other Reasons up to the Satisfaction of the Principal, is eligible to appear for the Additional Examination.
- d. A student, who does not appear at both Semester Examinations in a particular paper/subject shall not be eligible to appear for the Additional examination in that paper/subject.

PROJECT EVALUATION (IF APPLICABLE)

- A student who PASSES IN ALL THE COURSES BUT DOES NOT secures minimum grade of E in project as applicable has to resubmit a fresh project till he/she secures a minimum of grade E.
- > The credits and grade points secured by him/her in the other courses will be carried forward and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by them on passing of all the courses.
- The evaluation of project and viva/voce examination shall be done by marks only and then it will be converted into grade in the seven point scale and award the same to the student.
- A student shall have to obtain minimum of grade E (or its equivalent marks) in project evaluation and viva/voce taken together to obtain 40% marks in project work.

FREE EDUCATION

FOR GIRLS STUDENTS UPTO STD. XII

- I The Government of Maharashtra has extended the facility of Free Education to girl students upto Std. XII from the year 1985-86. They are, however, not exempted from the payment of the HSC Examination Fees and other deposits.
- I As per the directives of the Government, the Scheme of Free Education is available to following categories:
- i The benefit of this concession is to be given upto three children in a family. Thus the fourth and the subsequent child will not be eligible for this concession.
 - i. This concession is available to girl students whose parents are residents of Maharashtra State for at least 15 years, and
 - i If a girl student fails to pass in any class, the concession shall be withdrawn from the instant. After she passes and is promoted to the next higher standard, the concession will be resumed again.
 - iv. The Parents/Guardians will have to submit a Declaration Form duly filled in to the office at the time of admission, alongwith two Xerox copies of Ration Card. Copies of this form can be obtained from the College office.

Annexure 'A'

UGC Regulation, 2009 for curbing the menace of Ragging in the Institutions of Higher Educations as per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court has issued Regulations vide No. F.1-16/ 2007 (CPP-II) dated 09-07-2009, in which the Ragging is defines as under:

What constitutes Ragging: Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student:
- Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student:
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student:
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students:
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Duties and Responsibilities of the Parents/and other student:

- a. It shall be the responsibility of the parents/guardians of fresher to promptly bring any instance of ragging to the notice of the Head of the Institution.
- b. Every student studying in the institution and his/her parents/ guardians shall provide the specific affidavits required under clauses (d), (e) and (g) of Regulation 6.1 of these Regulations at the time of admission or registration, as the case may be, during each academic year.
